"During the weekly activities, I can speak English more than in the whole week in the face to face classrooms."

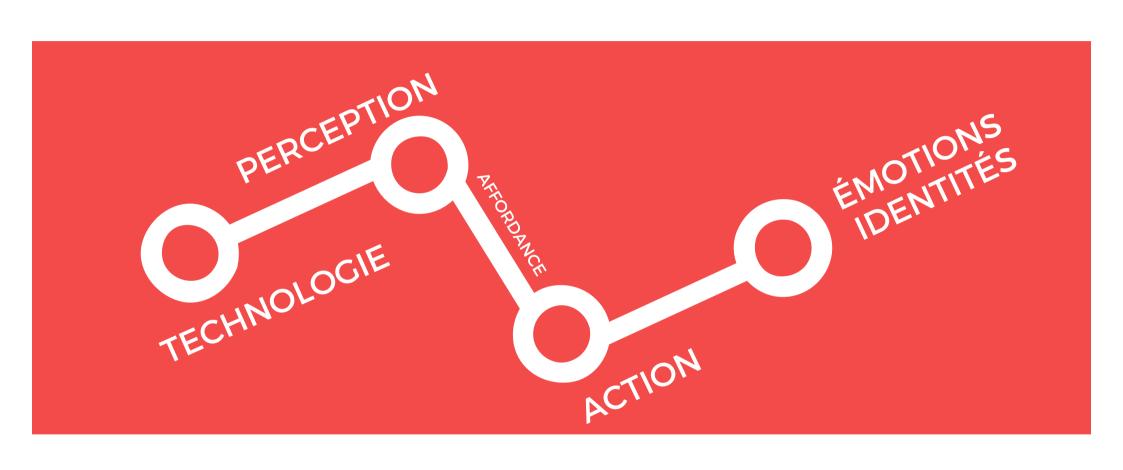


"'Famous person avatar' was also very interesting, because it forced us to know what the audio wants to say, so we could interact with the classmates and find out who the famous person was."

I used to listen to many classmates' productions to evaluate how I should record my audios. I felt I needed to make scripts in the first activities because, when I tried to record my audios without it, I stuttered a lot and sounded very confusing. I also had the impression that my pronunciation was impared due to my nervousness, what, ironically, made me feel more nervous. After some weeks, I felt more comfortable in the classroom and I realized that, just like me, my classmates also made mistakes and many of them didn't seem to be so bothered with their mistakes and spoke much more naturally. It was then that I started trying to record my audios with no script. I started to elaborate the answer mentally and then I recorded the audio. At first, I was a little nervous and bothered with the natural pauses of my speech or even when I had to repeat some word to correct the pronunciation, but I did not care that much about that in the end. I believe that speaking without scripts helped me develop the naturalness of my oral production in English, besides helping me gain more confidence to share my production in an online environment.
